<b>in</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• the morning, the afternoon, the evening</li><li>• my free time</li></ul>
<b>on</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Monday, Tuesday, etc.</li><li>• Sunday</li><li>• morning/afternoon/evening/night</li><li>• weekdays</li></ul>
