Present Perfect Continuous Structure:

subject + **have/has been** + **verb** + **-ing**

Example: I **have been studying** Japanese for three years.

Positive: She has been playing the guitar all morning.

Negative: She hasn't been playing the guitar all morning.

Question: Has she been playing the guitar all morning?

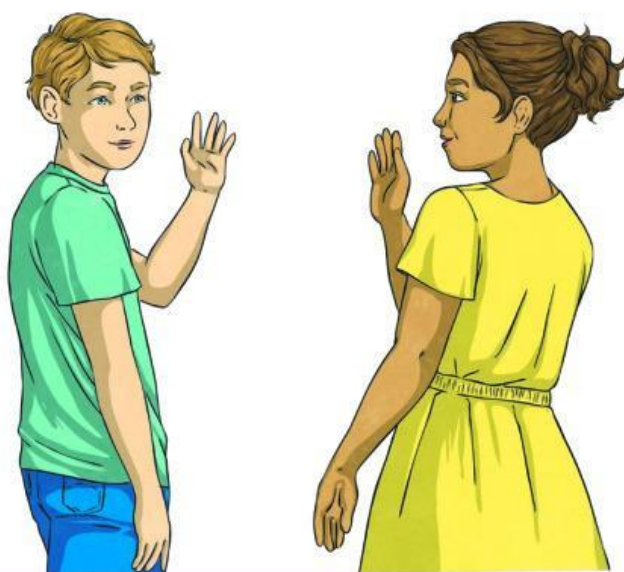
