The future simple tense with “will” is used to talk about spontaneous decisions, promises, or predictions.

Negative:

Affirmative:

Subject + will + verb (base form).

Subject + won't (will not) + verb (base form).

Question:

Will + Subject + verb (base form) + ?

Affirmative:

Sarah will cook dinner for us.

Examples

Negative:

Sarah won't cook dinner for us.

Question:

Will Sarah cook dinner for us.
