The problem with social media

No one can doubt that our lives have been totally changed by social media. On one social media platform, more than 50,000 messages are posted every second. On another, more than 500,000 photos are uploaded every minute. It looks like social media platforms have achieved their goal of connecting people! So why are there so many arguments on social media? And why do some people think there should be stricter controls about what we can say?

To understand the problem, we need to understand the beginnings of the internet. When it was created back in the 1980s, programmers imagined the internet would be a space for free speech. They argued that governments and other organisations shouldn't decide what people can say online. Social media platforms have continued to follow that belief, but it has caused many problems. For example, what do you do if someone lies on social media or says horrible things about other people? Do you let them carry on or do you remove their post?

In some countries it is illegal to deceive people in public, including on social media. If you break those laws, you may have to pay a fine or go to prison. However, in other countries the social media companies are responsible for managing people's posts. If your post breaks the rules, it can be removed. Apart from lies, this also includes spam and violent language. The problem is that some people are angry about social media companies making the rules. They believe their right to free speech is being taken away.

Another problem is how social media companies decide what is acceptable. Hardly any posts are checked by humans because it's cheaper for computers to do it. However, they often make mistakes because human communication is difficult to understand. Try telling a joke to a computer and see how it responds! Because of this, some appropriate posts are removed, while some inappropriate ones are not. As a result, social media companies have been blamed for not doing enough to deal with the problem.

Social media can be a great way to connect with other people. However, it can also be a stressful environment where people are 'virtually' yelling at each other. So far, neither governments nor the platforms themselves have worked out how to solve this problem. So what can we do to make sure that we have a positive experience on social media? Firstly, we need to take responsibility for what we post. Secondly, we need to check that messages are true before forwarding them. Finally, we need to talk things over calmly and avoid being aggressive.
