What's it worth?

What would you say is the job with the best salary? Of course, we all know that actors and sports stars can earn enormous sums of money, so let's consider instead those careers which are a bit more usual in everyday life. One recent study in the United Kingdom showed that airline pilots are among the highest paid people in the country. People typically think that a pilot's job is one of the best in the world as it offers opportunities both to see the world and to earn good money. That can be true, especially for pilots with many years of service on long-haul flights. However, it's a different story for the flight attendants, who earn far less than those who actually fly the planes.

Another well-paid job is that of a doctor. Studying and training for at least seven years at university is not cheap, however, and just like pilots, doctors are responsible for looking after people, in some ways. That's why those heading for the top of the medical profession or aviation industry can look forward to earning some of the highest salaries in the country.

However, we can't all be doctors and pilots, can we? There will always be people who earn much less than others. Some of the lowest-paid jobs are often the ones working with customers in restaurants and bars. Hairdressers and sales assistants in supermarkets are often paid a minimum salary. However, one advantage for waiters is that customers can leave tips, and that can make a big difference. More experienced hairdressers also receive tips in some countries.

Talking to a couple of my friends who work in supermarkets, I realized that money isn't always the most important issue when choosing a job. Both of them are parents with young children, and they enjoy being able to choose their working hours, despite the fact that they realize they could earn more in an office, for example. They also feel less stressed than they would in a job with more responsibility, and they are satisfied where they are.

It's certainly true that different people earn very different salaries, but maybe money isn't everything.
