A family business

Jackie Smith is carefully stirring the mixture of the latest addition to her family company's successful range of health bars and cakes. She looks up and reassures me, 'If you look at the recipe, you'll see that there's hardly any sugar in this.' Although Jackie doesn't have to do any cooking these days, she still enjoys it, as it takes her mind off the day-to-day worries of running a big, lucrative business. 'The way I see it,' she explains, 'the CEO of any organisation shouldn't be scared of getting her hands dirty. But at least we have recipes these days!' she jokes. ¹ ____ 'In fact, we've just published a successful cookbook', she says proudly.

Not that Mr Smith Senior was a cook by profession. Far from it. He worked hard as a fruit juice salesman in a vain attempt to pay for his seven children's education. Jackie, the oldest sibling, says he used to tell her, 'If I'd gone to university, I'd probably have got a better job and we'd be well-off.' Mr and Mrs Smith had enough to make ends meet, but only just, and couldn't afford to buy their offspring expensive presents. ² ____ Jackie's mother spent most of her time working as a nurse in the local hospital, and never had time to make meals. Her husband had little choice but to cook for his large family which, it turned out, was a blessing in disguise as he was rather good at it, especially when it came to making cakes and snacks that would later become the famous 'Bite This!' bars. Though if his wife, a health professional, hadn't insisted on him using very little sugar, their story may well have been very different.

Jackie shows me a photo of her family when she was about fifteen years old. They look happy. She obviously has fond memories of this time despite their regular financial ups and downs. Her eyes light up when she tells me about how she and the older children would sometimes make pocket money by selling their dad's cakes and bars to their neighbours. 'It was then that I realised I wanted to be an entrepreneur', she says. Jackie took her studies seriously and decided to pursue a career in marketing. ³ ____ Hardly had she started when her family suffered some terrible news; her father became seriously ill and couldn't work. ⁴ ____ After a meeting with her three oldest brothers and sisters, they decided then and there to set up a business selling their father's healthy cakes and recipes.

That's six years ago now. I asked Jackie what the secret to their success was. 'Determination', she says, 'and one piece of amazing luck.' She had been at a school reunion with her oldest brother shortly after they'd started the business, and had got talking to an old friend, Malcolm, who was working as a management consultant. By chance, Malcolm mentioned that one of his clients was a well-known food and drinks company. 'If only they'd invest in our business!' Jackie had commented. Their old school friend put them in touch with his client, who bought 25% of the company. And the rest is history! 'Dad's illness took its toll on all of us. It was touch and go at one stage, but Dad got through it. He's very proud of all of us.'

So, what about the future of the business? ⁵ ____ She's a resourceful CEO who has come a long way and is determined to keep fighting for success. 'A lot is at stake every time I make a decision', she comments. 'I've never made a blunder and I don't intend to!'
