Coffee is one of the world's most popular drinks. About 80% of coffee is produced on small farms in countries such as Mexico, Peru, Brazil and Colombia.

How can we support these small farms and still get a good price for coffee products?

Coffee was one of the first products to carry the FAIRTRADE label. Through the FAIRTRADE organisation, farmers receive fair prices for their beans. The organisation also makes investments into their communities. This helps to improve farming and protects the environment. Farmers can work together in a co-operative and buy new equipment which helps increase production.

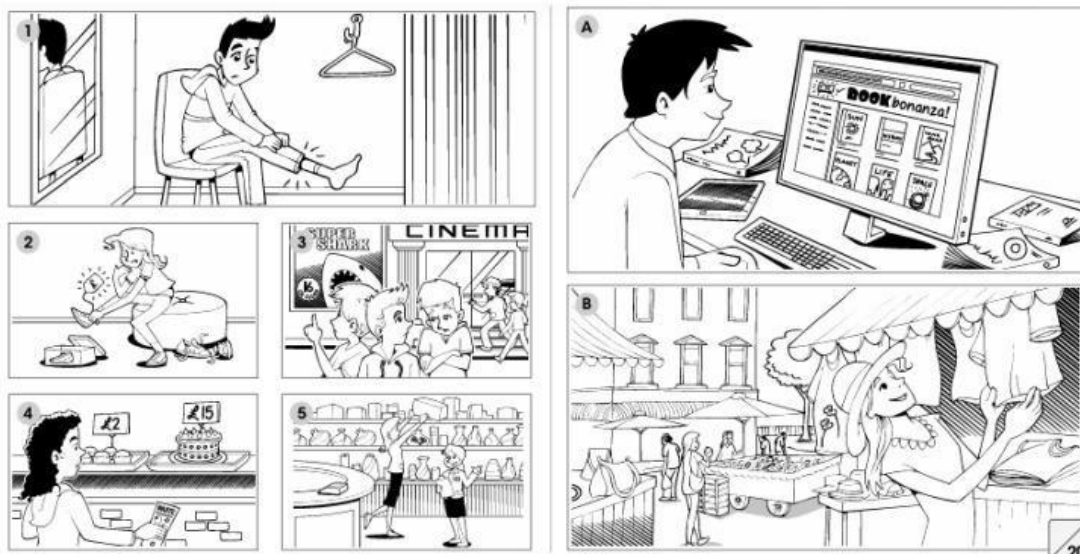
