Rome first had kings, later became a republic, and finally an empire. During the Pax Romana, Rome enjoyed peace and built roads and aqueducts. Christianity began during Roman rule. At first Christians were persecuted, but later Christianity became official. Islam began in Arabia and spread into North Africa.

After the fall of the Western Roman Empire, Europe entered the Middle Ages. Feudalism developed as a system based on land and loyalty. Lords owned land, knights served in battle, peasants worked the fields, and monasteries preserved books and learning.
