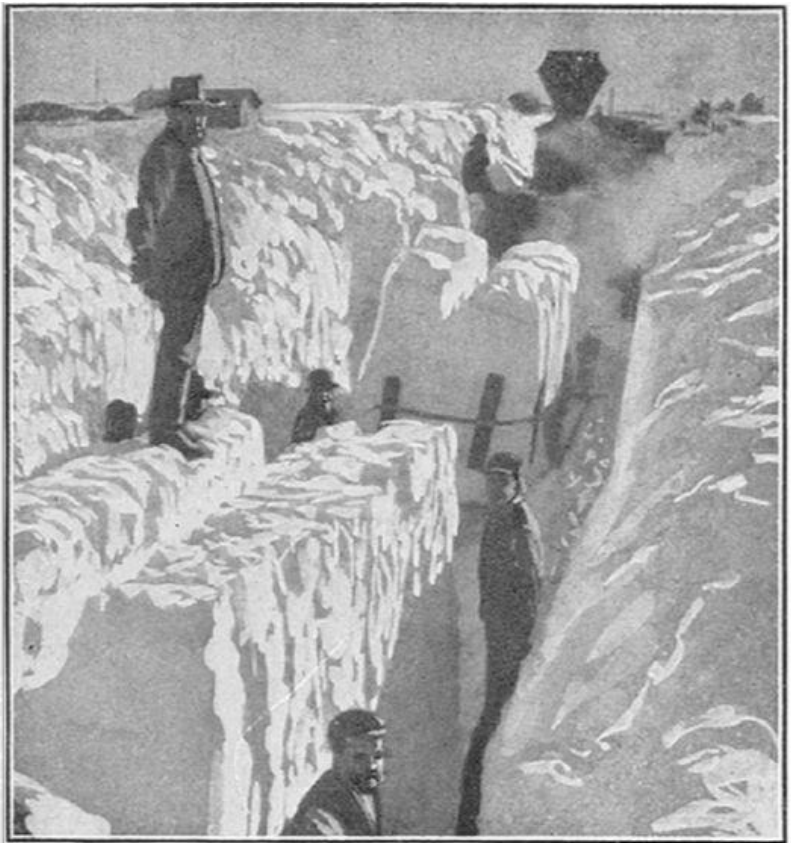


# THE SNOW WINTER OF 1880-1881

- 1 The winter of 1880-1881 was one of the **worst / most bad** winters in American history.
- 2 The **too famous / most famous** description of this winter is in Laura Ingalls Wilder's book *The Long Winter*.
- 3 Several towns were snowbound for months and people **didn't have enough / had too much** food to last the winter.
- 4 The farmers **were too slow / slowest** to harvest their crops before the snow fell.
- 5 The Chicago and North Western railway closed because there **were were too many / weren't enough** men to clear snow from the tracks.
- 6 The snow was **not deep enough / too deep** for the cattle to graze and thousands of cows starved to death.
- 7 The **biggest / too big** snow drifts were more than 3.5 m deep.

I hear some people are mad at Facebook, so here's the article.

Many would agree that this winter has overstayed its welcome. However, this year's weather is nothing compared to the "Snow Winter" of 1880-1881. Immortalized in Laura Ingalls Wilder's novel *The Long Winter*, that season kicked off with a record-setting blizzard in October 1880, followed by several more months of consistent snowfall, and major snowstorms in January, March, and April of 1881. By spring, the snow averaged 11 feet deep across much of Minnesota. Many railroad lines were shut down for months, and some communities remained entirely isolated until the snows finally started to melt in May of 1881. Nicknamed the "Snow Winter," the 1880-1881 season remains the snowiest and longest-lasting Midwestern winter ever recorded.

The 1880s, as a decade, are the snowiest on record across the Upper Midwest. Though no other year topped the total accumulation of 1880-81, the years 1885, 1886, 1887, 1888, and 1889 were also marked by a string of catastrophic blizzards. Modern meteorologists believe that the continued fallout from the 1883 eruption of Mount Krakatoa in Indonesia is partially responsible for this period of severe winters.

Incidentally, these were the same years that the bulk of James J. Hill's Great Northern Railway was being built. Despite frequent delays due to the snowfall, Hill's crews nonetheless managed to set track-laying records and meet deadlines. For the workers, this meant a great deal of labor spent clearing snow, and sometimes even laying tracks in near-whiteout conditions.
