Across neighbourhoods in the United States, a quiet but powerful movement is growing — the Little Free Library. These are small wooden boxes, often shaped like tiny houses, filled with free books. Anyone can take a book or leave one. This simple idea has helped bring books closer to people and promote a love for reading in communities.

Little Free Libraries can be found in front yards, parks, schools, and even near bus stops. They are easy to use and available to everyone, especially those who may not have easy access to public libraries. These libraries work on trust and sharing. People are encouraged to take a book they like and bring back another book when they can. This creates a sense of connection and responsibility among neighbours.

The impact goes beyond just books. These small libraries help build a stronger reading culture by making reading feel friendly and fun. Children and adults alike stop by, explore new stories, and sometimes meet others who love reading too. Some boxes are decorated by local artists or students, making each library unique and **inviting**.

Started in 2009 by Todd Bol in Wisconsin, the movement has now grown worldwide, with more than 100,000 Little Free Libraries in over 100 countries. It has inspired thousands of people to become "stewards" — caretakers who maintain and restock their local boxes. These stewards often say that the library becomes a small but meaningful part of their community. In a world full of screens and fast information, the Little Free Library reminds us of the joy of holding a book, reading at our own pace, and sharing stories with others.
