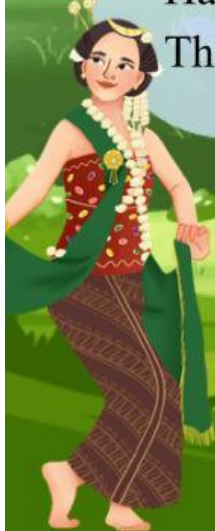

CONCEPT EXPLANATION

What is a Recount Text?

A recount text tells about past events or experiences. The purpose of a recount text is to retell what happened in the past.

What about the structure?

This is the structure

Structure of Recount Text

Orientation

Tells who, when, and where.

Example:
Last August, my school celebrated Independence Day at the school field.

Events

Tells what happened in order.

Example:
First, we had a ceremony. Then, we joined some games.

Reorientation

Tells feeling or personal comment.

Example:
It was a very exciting day.



Language Features



SIMPLE PAST TENSE



We use Simple Past Tense for actions that happened in the past.

FORMULA:

Subject + Verb 2

Example:

I **joined** the race.



REGULAR VERBS



play → played
join → joined
celebrate → celebrated
watch → watched
clean → cleaned

IRREGULAR VERBS



win → won
go → went
feel → felt
see → saw
hold → held

NEGATIVE FORM

Subject + **did not** + verb 1

Example:

I **did not** win the race.



I didn't win.

QUESTION FORM

Did + subject + verb 1?

Example:

Did you join the competition?



Remember!

Look for time expressions!

EXAMPLES OF TIME EXPRESSIONS

yesterday

last year

last week

two days ago

in 2023

a moment ago
