Tomorrow we're visiting Wanzhou! The brochure says "Wanzhou is a small pretty mountainous city. Its tangerines and oranges are famous across the whole country. I'm looking forward to those.

I'm sharing a cabin on the boat with my younger brother, Tamer. My sister Sara always gets a room to herself but I like having company. The cabin is a generous size but Tamer seems to take up a lot of the space because he's so messy! It's not as if there aren't enough cupboards. We have a balcony where I sit to escape from him!

There are a number of activities available on board the boat, so it's hard to choose. I do Tai Chi with Sara, only because she made me do it. It was a good choice though. Mum tells me I have to attend youth club with Tamer, even though everyone there is his age. We play games like dodge ball, which I suppose is better than aerobics. That's what mum and Sara do while I'm with Tamer.

There are shows each night. My favourite is a performance of Chinese dance. The dancers wear face masks portraying faces of famous characters. What really makes it worth watching is how they change between characters by switching masks – you just don't see it happen. They also wear incredibly bright costumes and move to exciting music with drums beating loudly. There are lights flashing and smoke rising from the stage which adds to the atmosphere.
