SIMPLE PAST TENSE



We use the simple past to talk about actions that happened and finished in the past.

AFFIRMATIVE

I / You / He / She / It / We / They
+ verb in past (regular: -ed / irregular)

I **played** tennis yesterday.

NEGATIVE

I / You / He / She / It / We / They
+ did not (didn't) + base verb

I **didn't go** to school last Friday.

QUESTION

Did + I / you / he / she / it / we / they
+ base verb?

Did you see that movie?

SPELLING RULES

- Regular verbs:
add -ed
play → played
- Verbs ending in -e:
add -d
like → liked
- Verbs ending in consonant + y:
change y to i and add -ed
study → studied
