(+)

I/ You/ We/ They + have + Ved/ V3
He/ She/ It + has + Ved/ V3

Example

She **has taught** English for 5 years.

(-)

I/ You/ We/ They + haven't + Ved/ V3
He/ She/ It + hasn't + Ved/ V3

Example

I **haven't finished** my homework yet.
