POSSESSIVE NOUNS

Al Smith is **Kate's** boss.

I am **Ms. Tan's** student.

We are **Sara and Todd's** neighbors.

POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES

He is **her** boss. She is **my** teacher.

I→my you→your he→his she→her we→our they→their

We are **their** neighbors. Marty is **our** classmate.

BE FROM / QUESTIONS WITH WHERE

I'm **from** Toronto. | Are you **from** Paraguay? — Yes, I am. / No, I'm not.

Where **are** you from? — We're from Bangkok. | Where's she from? — She's from Canada.

Contractions: Where is → Where's | Where are — NOT Where're

Be careful! Are you from Spain? — Yes, I am. NOT Yes, I'm from.
