Pronoun	BE Verb (No Action)	Action Verb (With Action)
I	Are you a student? → Yes, I <u>am</u> . / No, I <u>am not</u> .	Do you play soccer? → Yes, I <u>do</u> . / No, I <u>don't</u> .
he / she / it	<u>Is</u> he happy? → Yes, he <u>is</u> . / No, he <u>isn't</u> .	Does he play soccer? → Yes, he <u>does</u> . / No, he <u>doesn't</u> .
you / we / they	<u>Are</u> they tall? → Yes, they <u>are</u> . / No, they <u>aren't</u> .	Do they play soccer? → Yes, they <u>do</u> . / No, they <u>don't</u> .
