Understanding the Skills

Literal Comprehension

Literal comprehension means understanding information that is **directly stated** in the text.

Example:

"The dog barked loudly at the mail carrier."

Literal Question:

Who did the dog bark at?

Answer: The mail carrier.

Inferential Comprehension

Inferential comprehension means using clues from the text and your own thinking to figure out information that is **not directly stated**.

Example:

"The dog barked loudly and wagged its tail when the owner came home."

Inferential Question:

How did the dog probably feel?

Answer: Excited or happy.
