

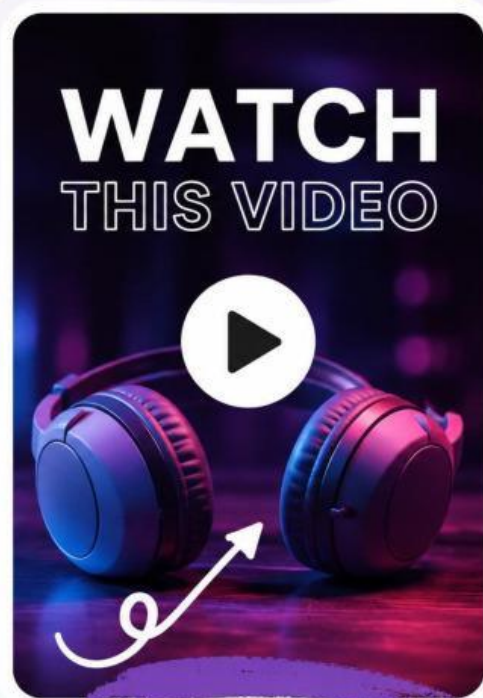


Music has always been more than just sound—it's a force. It moves people, fuels revolutions, inspires change, and sometimes... gets banned. Across history, governments and institutions around the world have feared the power of music to stir emotions and ideas. The result? Entire genres have been silenced, censored, or outright banned. From jazz to rock, hip-hop to heavy metal, music has often found itself on the frontlines of cultural and political battles.

WHY DO SONGS GET BANNED?

Here are the most common reasons:

- 
Political dissent
 Songs that criticize governments or challenge the political system.
- 
Religious opposition
 Lyrics or imagery that conflict with religious beliefs or values.
- 
Cultural preservation
 Protecting local traditions and values from foreign or modern influences.
- 
Fear of youth rebellion
 Worry that certain music will inspire young people to rebel or behave badly.
- 
Foreign influence or Westernization
 Concerns that foreign music will replace local culture or promote Western ideas.

9	Shape of You	Ed Sheeran	Some lyrics edited for radio	Radio edits in multiple countries
10	WAP	Cardi B & Megan Thee Stallion	Explicit sexual content	Banned or heavily censored on radio and TV in several countries
11	Rolling in the Deep	Adele	Minor lyric edits for radio	Edited in some countries
12	Gangnam Style	Psy	Banned by one TV network because of a scene involving property damage	South Korea
13	Hotel California	Eagles	Misinterpreted as promoting negative values	Restricted in some schools and radio stations
14	Bohemian Rhapsody	Queen	Some lyrics considered controversial	Limited radio play in a few countries
15	Baby One More Time	Britney Spears	Criticism of the music video and image	Restricted by some TV programs

1	 Censorship	Control of music, media, or information.	Some countries use censorship on music and TV shows.
2	 Ban	To officially prohibit something.	The radio decided to ban the song.
3	 Lyrics	The words of a song.	The song's lyrics were controversial.
4	 Explicit	Containing offensive or adult content.	The album has explicit language.
5	 Controversy	Strong public disagreement.	The music video created a big controversy .
6	 Violence	Physical harm or aggression.	The song was criticized for promoting violence .
7	 Political	Related to government or politics.	The artist shared a political message in the song.
8	 Religious	Connected to religion.	Some people disliked the song for religious reasons.
9	 Broadcast	To play on TV or radio.	The station refused to broadcast the song.
10	 Restriction	A rule that limits something.	There were age restrictions for the concert.
11	 Offensive	Rude or upsetting.	Some listeners found the lyrics offensive .

14	 Freedom of Speech	The right to express opinions freely.	Artists often defend freedom of speech .
15	 Protest Song	A song criticizing social or political problems.	The band wrote a protest song about war.
16	 Media	TV, radio, newspapers, and the internet.	The media talked about the banned song for weeks.
17	 Scandal	A shocking or controversial event.	The performance caused a huge scandal .
18	 Influence	The power to affect people's ideas or behavior.	Music can influence young people.
19	 Audience	The people who watch or listen.	The audience loved the concert.
20	 Content Warning	A notice about sensitive material.	The video included a content warning at the beginning.
