

PERMANENT VS TEMPORARY SITUATIONS**A. Quick Grammar Reminder****1. Present Simple for permanent or long-term situations.**

Ta dùng Present Simple khi nói về một tình huống tương đối ổn định, lâu dài, hoặc đúng trong một khoảng thời gian dài.

Examples:

- I live in Hanoi. → Đây là nơi ở chính thức / lâu dài của tôi.
- My father works for a technology company. → Đây là công việc ổn định của bố tôi.
- She studies at a bilingual school. → Đây là tình trạng học tập lâu dài.
- This shop sells imported books. → Đây là hoạt động kinh doanh thường xuyên của cửa hàng.

2. Present Continuous for temporary situations.

Ta dùng Present Continuous khi nói về một tình huống tạm thời, chỉ diễn ra trong một giai đoạn hiện tại, không nhất thiết là mãi mãi.

Examples:

- I am living with my aunt until my new flat is ready. → Tôi đang ở tạm với cô.
- My father is working from home this week. → Tuần này bố tôi làm việc ở nhà, không phải lúc nào cũng vậy.
- She is studying online for a few weeks. → Cô ấy đang học online tạm thời.
- The shop is selling everything at half price because it is closing down. → Đây là tình huống tạm thời.

B. Notice the Difference

Pair 1

I live in Hanoi. → Tôi sống ở Hà Nội lâu dài.

I'm living in Hanoi for six months. → Tôi đang sống ở Hà Nội trong 6 tháng, chỉ là tạm thời.

Pair 2

He works in the marketing department. → Công việc / vị trí lâu dài.

He's working in the marketing department this month. → Tháng này anh ấy đang làm ở đó tạm thời.

Pair 3

She teaches English. → Cô ấy là giáo viên tiếng Anh / đây là nghề nghiệp.

She's teaching English at a summer camp. → Cô ấy đang dạy tiếng Anh ở trại hè trong một thời gian ngắn.

Pair 4

They stay at this hotel every summer. → Đây là thói quen lặp lại.

They're staying at this hotel until Friday. → Họ đang ở khách sạn này tạm thời đến thứ Sáu.
