

EXTENSION INTERACTION. Interviewing a Rural Professional

In this interaction activity, you will take on the role of a person who works in a traditional rural job (farmer, baker, shepherd, butcher, forestry worker, shop owner, etc.). You will respond to a series of questions in different formats, just as you would in a real interview.

You will receive several prompts: some will be audio questions, which you must answer by recording your own audio, and others will be written questions, which you must answer in writing. Your goal is to react naturally, provide clear information and show that you can interact using the language and ideas studied throughout the unit.

- 5 Could you reformulate, in your own words, something a neighbour or family member has said about how your job has changed?
- 6 What do you think the future of your profession will look like, and what makes you think so? (Use an adverb of deduction.)
