#### **A. Read the definitions and match them with the correct bad driving habit.**

1. To drive straight through an intersection when a traffic light is red instead of coming to a full stop.
2. To drive dangerously close behind another vehicle.
3. To overtake and go around another car in an area where doing so is illegal and dangerous (usually marked by solid lines on the road).
4. To drive faster than the legal limit or faster than what is safe for the road conditions.
5. To read, write, or send text messages on a phone while steering a vehicle.
6. To turn or change lanes without using the blinking indicator lights to warn other drivers.
7. To repeatedly and quickly change lanes to get ahead of other cars in crowded traffic.

#### **B. Read the definitions and match them with the correct part of the car.**

1. The round, rubber parts filled with air that roll on the ground.
2. The metal cover at the front of the car that protects the engine.
3. The entrance panel used to get into or out of the vehicle.
4. A small window in the roof of the car that can open to let in air and light.
5. The bright front lights used to see the road at night or in bad weather.
6. The protective bars at the very front and back of the car designed to absorb impact in minor crashes.
7. The red lights at the back of the car that turn on when the headlights are on or when braking.
8. The rubber blades that wipe rain, snow, or dirt off the front glass.
9. The mirrors on the outside of the front doors used to see vehicles next to or behind you.
10. The machine/motor that powers the car and makes it move.
11. The glass panels on the side doors that can be rolled up or down.
12. The storage compartment at the back of the car used for luggage or groceries.
13. The large front window glass that protects passengers from wind and debris.

#### **C. Write the part of the car described in the definition**

1. The blinking lights (front and back) used to show other drivers you plan to turn left or right.
2. foot pedal in the middle that you press to slow down or stop the car.
3. The round wheel the driver turns to guide the car left or right.



4. The safety strap worn across the body to protect passengers in a crash.
5. The panel in front of the driver that displays gauges (like speed and fuel level) and controls.
6. The mirror inside the car attached to the windshield used to see what is directly behind you.
7. The foot pedal on the right that you press to make the car go faster.
8. The lever used by the driver to change gears (e.g., Park, Reverse, Drive).
9. A device controlled from the steering wheel that makes a loud warning noise.
10. A hand-pulled lever used to keep the car from rolling when parked.
11. The foot pedal on the far left (only in manual cars) pressed down to change gears.
