

Explanation	<p>Study the following:</p> <p>A Have a look. What do you think?</p> <p>B Oh dear--</p> <p>A What's the matter?</p> <p>B it's not big enough.</p> <p>A It's too small?</p> <p>B Exactly. And it's not colourful enough.</p> <p>A Really?</p> <p>B And I'm afraid it's not heavy enough It's not heavy enough.</p> <p>A Not heavy enough?</p> <p>B How much did it cost?</p> <p>A It was very cheap</p> <p>B Well, that's the problem. It doesn't look expensive enough.</p> <p>A Shall I take it back to the shop?</p> <p>B I think you should.</p> <p>Form: Too + adjective/adverb adjective/adverb + enough enough+ noun</p> <p>Usage: Too and enough indicate a degree (or amount) in English sentences. too = more than necessary. enough = the necessary amount. not enough = less than necessary .</p>				



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Examples:

- ❖ Dave is **intelligent enough** to do the right thing.
- ❖ You're not working **fast enough**.
- ❖ I don't have **enough time**.
- ❖ He has **too many friends**.
- ❖ I have cooked **too much pasta**.
- ❖ She has got **too much patience**.
- ❖ Jane is always tired because she works **too hard**.
- ❖ Never **too old (or late) to learn**.
