MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

A medical emergency is a situation in which a person needs immediate medical attention. Medical emergencies can happen anywhere, such as at home, at school, at work, or in public places. Knowing what to do can help save lives.

One common medical emergency is a heart attack. People experiencing a heart attack may feel chest pain, shortness of breath, or discomfort in their arms, neck, or jaw. Another emergency is a stroke, which can affect a person's ability to speak, move, or understand others. In both cases, it is important to call emergency services as quickly as possible.

Accidents can also cause medical emergencies. For example, a person may suffer severe bleeding after a fall or a car accident. If someone is bleeding heavily, pressure should be applied to the wound while waiting for professional help.

Some emergencies are caused by allergic reactions. Certain foods, medicines, or insect stings can trigger a serious reaction. Symptoms may include swelling, difficulty breathing, or dizziness. People with severe allergies often carry special medication prescribed by a doctor.

It is useful for people to learn basic first aid skills. These skills can help them respond calmly until medical professionals arrive. However, first aid is not a replacement for professional medical treatment.
