Grammar Review Quick-Guide

How to Form the Present Perfect:

Subject + Have / Has + Past Participle (V3)

- Use **have** for: I, You, We, They
- Use **has** for: He, She, It

Affirmative (+)	Negative (-)	Interrogative (?)
I have visited Paris.	I have not (haven't) visited Paris.	Have you visited Paris?
She has finished her work.	She has not (hasn't) finished her work.	Has she finished her work?
