For young people, planning a career now means more than choosing a job they like. They also need to understand how work is changing. In the past, a person might learn one set of skills and use it for many years. Today, however, technology and new customer needs are changing the way people work.

Automation is one clear example. When a machine can do a task faster, more accurately and at a lower cost, that task may become **obsolete**. This has happened to some simple jobs in ticket offices, factories and service counters. However, technology does not only take work away. **It** also creates new opportunities in fields such as online business, video editing, digital services and software development.

Because of these changes, workers need more than technical knowledge. They often have to **collaborate** with other people, share information, and solve problems together. A doctor may work with nurses and technicians to manage digital records, and a hairdresser may use an online booking app to arrange visits and communicate with customers before they arrive. Even jobs that seem practical or traditional may now require basic digital skills.

There is no single career path that suits every student. University may be the right choice for some, while vocational courses may help others prepare for skilled work sooner. To build a successful future, teenagers should develop useful skills, stay curious, and be prepared for further changes in the job market.
