## ★ PAST OF THE VERB BE ★

FORM	STRUCTURE	EXAMPLE	NOTES
 <b>AFFIRMATIVE</b>	<b>Subject + was/were + complement</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>was</b> → I, he, she, it, singular nouns</li> <li><b>were</b> → we, you, they, plural nouns</li> </ul>	Diego <b>was</b> confident. The players <b>were</b> excited.	Use <b>was</b> with singular subjects. Use <b>were</b> with plural subjects.
 <b>NEGATIVE</b>	<b>Subject + wasn't/weren't + complement.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>wasn't</b> → I, he, she, it, singular nouns</li> <li><b>weren't</b> → we, you, they, plural nouns</li> </ul>	Diego <b>wasn't</b> nervous. The fans <b>weren't</b> bored.	Add <b>not</b> after <b>was/were</b> . Short forms: <b>wasn't</b> = was not <b>weren't</b> = were not
 <b>QUESTION</b>	<b>Was/Were + subject + complement?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Was</b> → I, he, she, it, singular nouns</li> <li><b>Were</b> → we, you, they, plural nouns</li> </ul>	<b>Was</b> Diego confident? <b>Were</b> the players excited?	Put <b>was</b> or <b>were</b> before the subject. Questions always end with a question mark. <b>?</b>
 <b>SHORT ANSWER</b>	<b>Yes, subject + was/were.</b> <b>No, subject + wasn't/weren't.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Yes, ... → affirmative</li> <li>No, ... → negative</li> </ul>	<b>Was</b> Diego confident? Yes, he <b>was</b> . No, he <b>wasn't</b> .	Short answers are short and easy! 

#### QUICK RULE

- Use **was** / **wasn't** with I, he, she, it, and singular nouns.
- Use **were** / **weren't** with we, you, they, and plural nouns.



#### REMEMBER!

**Was/Were** = past of the verb **BE**.
