Verb + Infinitive (to + verb)	want, decide, hope, promise, offer, plan, refuse, agree, need	I decided to study French.

Teacher Instructions

Title: Verbs Followed by Infinitive or Gerund

Activity Type: Digital interactive worksheet (LiveWorksheets), grammar identification, sentence matching, and an independent writing production task.

Language Focus: Verbs followed by gerunds (-ing) or infinitives (to + verb).

Aim: By the end of this worksheet, students will be able to correctly identify which verbs require a gerund and which require an infinitive. Furthermore, they will apply this knowledge to accurately complete sentences and produce their own original ideas in written format.

Preparation: Devices (computers, tablets, or smartphones) with internet access for each student to open the LiveWorksheets link. No printed handouts are required.

Level: B1.

Time: 45 - 60 minutes.

Introduction: This digital material provides a structured and progressive review of verb patterns. It moves from highly controlled practice (fill-in-the-gaps) to semi-controlled (matching), culminating in a freer written production task where students personalize the target grammar.

Procedure:

- 1. Warm-up (5 mins):** Ask students what they "enjoy doing" and what they "want to do" this weekend. Write their answers on the board to visually highlight the difference between enjoy + gerund and want + infinitive.
- 2. Theory Review (10 mins):** Direct students to the "Grammar Notes" box at the top of the digital worksheet. Review the lists of common verbs and read the examples together.
- 3. Controlled Practice (10 mins):** Instruct students to complete Exercise 1 (Fill in the gaps) individually. Monitor their progress digitally or by walking around the classroom.
- 4. Semi-Controlled Practice (10 mins):** Have students complete Exercise 2 (Matching). Remind them to pay attention to context clues as well as the verb patterns.

Productive Skill - Writing (15 mins):

Explain Exercise 3. Emphasize that they must use their own ideas while maintaining the correct grammatical structure. Provide vocabulary support if necessary.

Submission & Feedback (10 mins):

Have students submit their interactive worksheets. Conduct a quick plenary session to review common mistakes and ask volunteers to share their creative sentences from Exercise 3.
