

Maths Assessment Grade 6: Fractions - Section A

1. Use common factors to simplify fractions; use common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination.

a) Simplify these fractions:

$\frac{5}{20}$	
$\frac{6}{9}$	
$\frac{9}{12}$	
$\frac{4}{8}$	
$\frac{8}{10}$	

b) Identify the equivalent fraction, using the denominators shown:

$\frac{2}{10}$	=	$\frac{\quad}{5}$
