

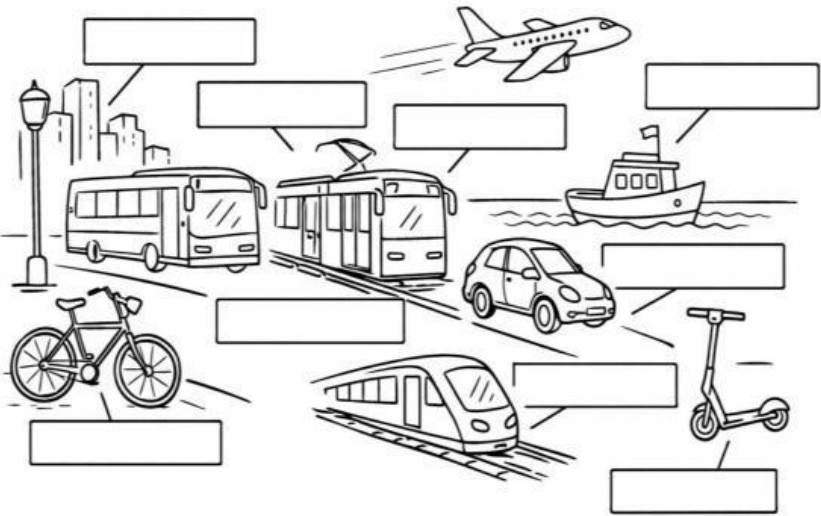
Wheels, Wings and Wi-Fi

How Teenagers Really Travel

Mia lives in a busy city where bicycles are used by thousands of students every day. Special bike lanes are built to make cycling safer. In the morning, the streets are filled with teenagers wearing headphones and riding to school.



Public transport is also widely used. Trams and buses are chosen because they are cheap and reliable. Monthly travel cards are bought by many families to save money. During winter, buses are preferred because they are warm and comfortable.

However, not all journeys are simple. When Mia visits her grandparents, a train is taken first, and then a ferry is used to cross the river. Tickets are often booked online, and seats are reserved in advance. Long-distance travel has been made easier by technology.

Of course, flying is still considered the fastest way to travel internationally. Planes are used when countries are separated by long distances. Safety rules are followed carefully, and luggage is checked before boarding.

Recently, electric scooters have become extremely popular. They are rented through mobile apps, and they are parked almost everywhere in the city. However, helmets are not always worn, and accidents are sometimes reported.

Mia has realised that every means of transport has advantages and disadvantages. Cars are convenient, but traffic is often caused by too many vehicles. Bicycles are healthy, but they can be dangerous in heavy rain. Trains are comfortable, but delays are sometimes announced.

In the future, more environmentally friendly vehicles will be developed. Roads will be shared by electric buses, smart cars and maybe even flying taxis. For Mia, transport is not just about getting somewhere — it is about independence.
