**present continuous** = a future arrangement that is already scheduled or organized.

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Future form	When do we use it?	Example
<b>be going to</b>	use it for plans, intentions, or something you have already decided to do. It is also used for predictions based on what you can see now.	<i>i am going to study tonight. / look at those clouds! it is going to rain.</i>
<b>will</b>	use it for spontaneous decisions, promises, offers, predictions, and future facts.	<i>i'll help you with your homework. / i think she will enjoy the movie.</i>
<b>present continuous for future</b>	use it for fixed plans or arrangements that have already been organized, often with a specific time or place.	<i>i am meeting my friend tomorrow. / we are flying to london next monday.</i>
