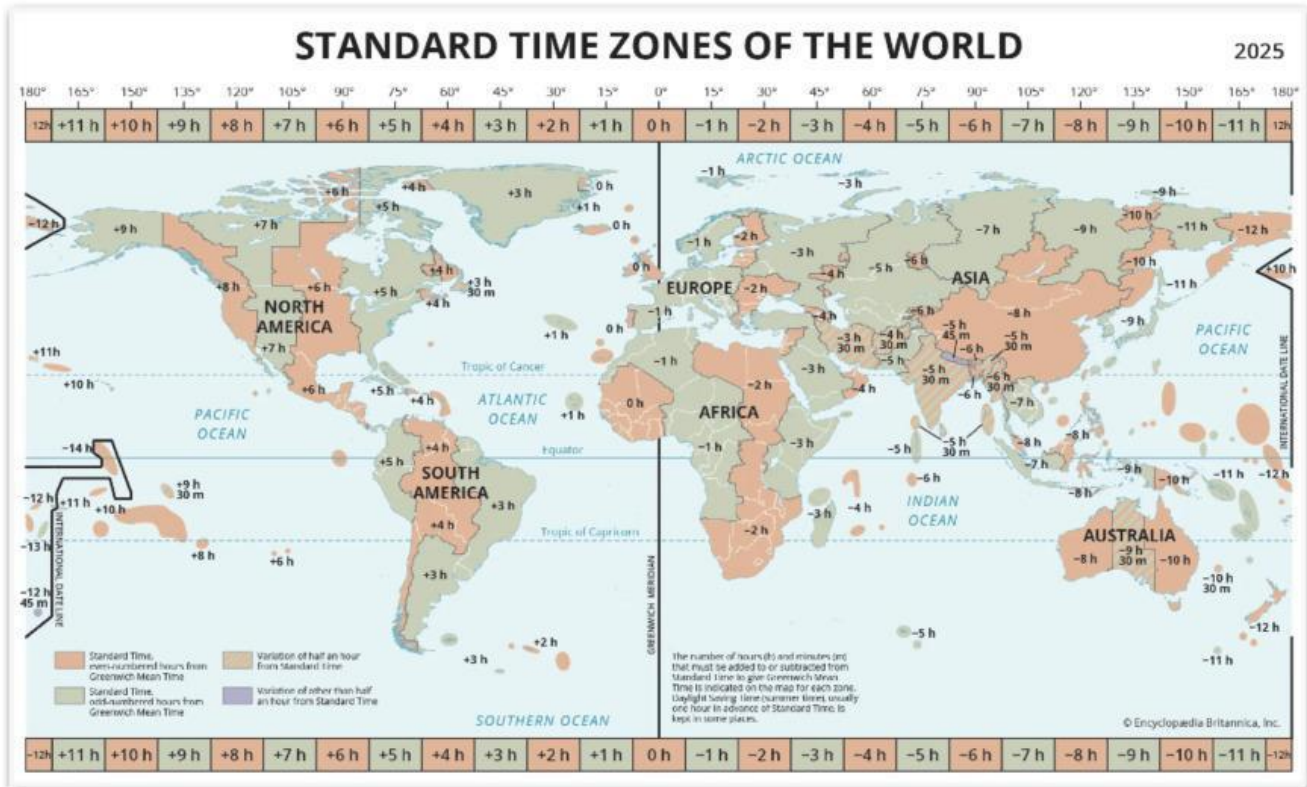

For example, Vietnam is 6 hours ahead of Egypt. When it is 8:00 a.m. in Vietnam, it is only 2:00 a.m. in Egypt. Most people in Egypt are still sleeping. South Korea is 2 hours ahead of

Vietnam. If it is 8:00 a.m. in Vietnam, it is 10:00 a.m. in South Korea. Children are usually having lessons at school. Brazil is 10 hours behind Vietnam. When children in Vietnam are eating dinner at 7:00 p.m., many people in Brazil are just having breakfast at 9:00 a.m. New Zealand is 5 hours ahead of Vietnam. When it is 8:00 a.m. in Vietnam, it is 1:00 p.m. in New Zealand. Many people are already studying or working. Knowing about time zones helps people choose the best time to call their friends, watch live sports, or join online meetings.
