- I'll begin cleaning the house at 10 p.m.
  - I'll still be cleaning the house after 10 p.m.
  - The house will already be clean before or at 10 p.m.
12. By the time the match starts, thousands of fans will have arrived.
- Thousands of fans will already be at the stadium before the match begins.
  - The fans will arrive after the match starts.
  - The fans will arrive during the match.
13. By the time you read this email, I'll have landed in Madrid.
- I'll already be in Madrid when you read the email.
  - I'll be flying while you read the email.
  - I'll leave for Madrid after you read the email.
14. By next Christmas, they will have lived here for ten years.
- They will complete ten years of living here by next Christmas.
  - They will move here next Christmas.
  - They moved here ten years after Christmas.
15. By the time the teacher checks our work, we'll have corrected all our mistakes.
- We'll correct our mistakes after the teacher checks them.
  - We'll be correcting our mistakes while the teacher is checking them.
  - We'll finish correcting our mistakes before the teacher checks them.
16. By the end of the concert, the orchestra will have played twelve pieces.
- The orchestra will already have finished performing twelve pieces when the concert ends.
  - The orchestra will start performing after the concert.
  - The orchestra will be practicing twelve pieces during the concert.
