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away bad things and bring good luck for the new year. But, you have to eat all the grapes really fast before the clock finishes striking midnight.

Japan: Eating Soba Noodles

In Japan, people start the new year by eating warm soba noodles. This tradition goes back a long time to a Buddhist temple that gave noodles to poor people. The long, thin noodles are easy to eat and mean leaving the old year behind. It's like starting fresh!

Philippines: Serving 12 Round Fruits

In the Philippines on New Year's Eve, families have a special tradition. They serve 12 round fruits, like apples, grapes, and plums. These fruits are round like coins, and people believe they bring good luck and success. Each fruit stands for one month of the year.
