The Awa people

The Awa people live in the Amazon rainforest in Brazil. While I was travelling around Brazil on a school project I met an Awa girl called Parakeet. She told me that 50 years ago the forest was a safe place for the Awa people. They were happy and life was easy. When they were hungry, they hunted for animals in the forest.

They didn't kill many animals or birds, only what they needed to survive.

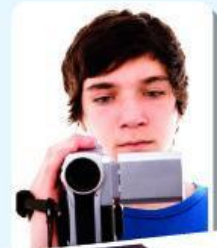
They swam in the rivers, which in those days were clean and clear. But then the big companies arrived and started cutting down the trees. The Awa could hear the loud noise of the machines as they pulled down the trees.

They were destroying the land where the Awa people lived. Now, the Awa people's lives are in danger. We must protect these people and the forest for their future and ours.



THE INUIT PEOPLE

Last year while I was making a film about the Inuit people of Alaska I met a teenage Inuit boy, Panuk. He told me that for hundreds of years, his people lived together in groups of families. They hunted whales and they caught fish. They used boats and sleds pulled by dogs to travel around. Life was hard in the freezing north. While Panuk was growing up, his father told him that the climate was changing. The summers were getting longer and the winters were getting shorter. The climate was not the same as it was when his father was a boy. The Inuits were worried because the temperature is important for the ice. It is becoming more difficult to catch fish because the ice is melting and the sea is getting warmer. Animals have moved to different areas so the Inuits can't hunt them. We must do everything we can to stop climate change so that we can protect the Inuits and their way of life.
