A

Drama and Debate Club

This club is for students who love performing in front of others. Members prepare short plays and debates for school competitions. Meetings are on Mondays after school, and students must be ready to speak to a large audience.

B

Coding for Beginners

Would you like to design a simple game or build a small website? This free club is perfect for students who are new to coding. We meet every Thursday after school in the computer room.

C

Eco Explorers

Join us on Saturday mornings for walks in the hills, wildlife watching and small clean-up projects. You will learn about local plants and animals while helping to protect the environment.

D

School Swimming Team

This club is for strong swimmers who want serious training. Sessions are on Friday evenings, and members can represent the school in competitions. You must be able to swim at least 100 metres confidently.

Recycled Art Workshop

In this Wednesday club, students use old paper, plastic bottles and cardboard to make creative models and decorations. If your work is not finished during the session, you can take it home and complete it later.

F

English Cafe

Photography Walks

Every Sunday, we walk around the town and take photographs of interesting buildings, streets and people. Students must bring their own camera or phone with a good camera.

This lunchtime club is for students who enjoy chess, puzzles and strategy games. It takes place indoors every Tuesday. The club is relaxed, but it does not include language practice or outdoor activities.
