Choosing a New Class Leader

Three students decide to become candidates. Their names are Narin, Pim, and Ton.

Narin enjoys organising school activities. He promises to help students finish class projects on time. He also wants to organise more sports competitions after school.

Pim is friendly and hardworking. She wants to improve communication between the teachers and students. She also plans to celebrate classmates' birthdays and organise study groups before examinations.

Ton is confident and enjoys speaking in front of people. He promises to listen carefully to everyone's ideas. He would also like to organise a school clean-up day every month to keep the school tidy.

Each candidate gives a two-minute speech to the class on Friday morning. After the speeches, every student receives a ballot paper and votes for one candidate.

Mr. David and two student volunteers count the votes carefully. The students wait quietly because they are excited to hear the result.

Pim receives 18 votes, Narin receives 14 votes, and Ton receives 8 votes.

The class congratulates Pim. She thanks everyone for their support and promises to work hard for the whole class. She reminds everyone that good teamwork is more important than winning.

The students are happy because the election was fair, respectful, and everyone had a chance to share their ideas.
