

Putting words together...



- If you **get dressed**, you put clothes on your body and if you **get undressed**, you take clothes off your body.
- If you **put on** clothes or shoes, you put them on your body and if you **take off** clothes, you take them off your body.

- If you **have** a dress, jacket, hat, etc. **on**, you are wearing it.
- If clothes **don't fit** or **don't fit very well**, they are too big or too small for your body.

Describing clothes



If you want to say something nice to someone about the clothes that they are wearing, you can say:

- *That jacket looks really nice on you.*
- *You look really nice in that dress.*
- *That coat really suits you.*

Exercise 4



Lucas and Tom are talking about the clothes they like to wear. Complete what they say. Listen and check.
