

Putting words together...



- ▶ If you travel to a place and then back again, you go **there and back**.
- ▶ If you take someone somewhere in your car, you **give them a lift (UK)/give them a ride (US)**, and they **get a lift (UK)/get a ride (US)** somewhere.
- ▶ If you want a ticket for one direction, you need a **single ticket** or a **one-way ticket**, and for both directions, you need a **return ticket**. If you want to make sure you can sit down on your journey, you can **reserve a seat**.
- ▶ When you want to sit next to someone else, you can say **'Is this seat free?'** or **'Is this seat taken?'**.

Giving directions



When you are telling someone the way to a place, you can say:

- ▶ **Turn right/left at the end of the road. Take the next turning on the right/left.**

If you want them to continue in the same direction, say:

- ▶ **Keep straight on. Go straight on for two miles.**

To tell someone how far it is to a place, you can say:

- ▶ **It's (quite) a long way. It's not far from here. It's only a short distance.**
