<u>Robert Louis Stevenson – Scotland’s Most Famous Children’s Author</u>	1
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Born in 1850, Stevenson was famous as the author of <i>Treasure Island</i> , <i>Kidnapped</i> and <i>The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde</i> .	3
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Stevenson attended Edinburgh University and qualified as a lawyer, he never practised law. During his time at university he became interested in socialist and atheist ideas, much to his father’s disapproval.	6
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He was often ill as a child and suffered from tuberculosis, so he spent most of his life travelling abroad to healthier climates. These travels inspired him to write about his time spent canoeing and riding donkeys in France. He later travelled by sea to America and continued his travels across the South Pacific; the scenery of this foreign land gave him the for his first novel, <i>Treasure Island</i> .	10
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The novel described a search for buried treasure and the battle of good (in the form of a boy, Jim, and his friends) against evil (personified by the one-legged pirate, Long John Silver).	16
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The theme of good and evil continued in his next novel, <i>The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde</i> , where Dr Jekyll discovers a drug that transforms him into the evil monster, Mr Hyde.	20
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Stevenson went on to write stories about the struggles of the Scottish people and his novel <i>Kidnapped</i> was published in 1886, followed by <i>The Black Arrow</i> and <i>The Master of Ballantrae</i> , both published in 1888.	24
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He finally settled in Samoa, where he died in 1894. Stevenson was greatly admired by his contemporaries and has been an inspiration for many writers. His books are still popular today and have been translated into several languages around the world.	28
