Words you need...



- ▶ **dry** describes the weather when it is not raining
- ▶ **a storm** bad weather with a lot of wind, rain and sometimes lightning
- ▶ **sun cream** a soft substance that you put on your skin to stop it burning in the sun
- ▶ **thunder** a loud, low noise in the sky that sometimes happens during a storm
- ▶ **waterproof** not allowing water in
- ▶ **wet** describes the weather when it is raining
