

Talking about things you like or dislike



To talk about whether you like or dislike something, you can say:

► *I find it very pleasant. I find them a bit boring.*

To say that someone likes something, you can say:

► *She's quite keen on Chinese food. He's very keen on football.*

If you like something, but do not have strong feelings about it, you can say:

► *I don't mind swimming. She doesn't mind staying in sometimes.*

If you like something a lot, you can say:

► *I really like your new coat.*

If you strongly dislike something, you can say:

► *I can't stand fish. I can't bear their music.*

If you like one thing more than another, you can say:

► *I prefer pasta. I prefer fish to meat. I prefer to study on my own.*

Asking about what people like or dislike

To ask about what someone likes or dislikes, you can say:

► *What do you think of the book? What's her house like? How's your meal? Are you pleased with your language course?*
