Today, I've given a survey to eight students in my class. I wanted to find out about their exciting or scary experiences. Here are the questions I asked and their answers.



Have you ever seen a famous person?

Have you ever tried surfing?

The students I asked haven't tried surfing, but Ana has tried skiing. She said it was difficult and cold, and she didn't really enjoy it. Sorry, Ana!



Have you ever held a large insect?

Three people have done this. It's on my wish list of things I'd like to do. I don't find insects scary, but I know a lot of people do.



Have you ever traveled to an exciting place?

Half of the students haven't been anywhere very exciting, but Daniel has visited New York City with his aunt and uncle. They saw the Statue of Liberty. I'd love to go there one day.



Have you ever won a competition?

Three people have won a competition. Ella won \$200 in an art competition last year. That's awesome, Ella! Joe won a cake in a quiz last Christmas. Joe, that's less awesome.



Have you ever been really scared?

Most people say they have been really scared. Carlos says the scariest moment of his life was when he slept in a tent on the side of a mountain. But only one person in this class has ever actually done something really scary, and that's me. I've been rock climbing and I've never been so scared in my life! I wonder if anyone can beat that!
