

Asking for and giving advice



To ask for advice, use phrases such as:

- ▶ *Do you think I should see a doctor? I need some advice about healthy eating.*

To ask for information, use phrases such as:

- ▶ *Can/Could you tell me where the railway station is? I'd like some information about English classes. Where can I find some information about hotels? Can you show me how to use this camera?*

To make a suggestion, use:

- ▶ *You could try asking Petra. Why don't you talk to him about it? Why not look for a better job?*

To give stronger advice, use:

- ▶ *It's a good idea to wash the fruit before you eat it. You should try to improve your English. You really should ask him to leave.*

To give very strong advice, use:

- ▶ *You must always lock the door. You mustn't go out after dark.*
