

45/ Filling in forms

Words you need...



- ▶ **to apply for something** to ask for something, for example a passport, in an official way
- ▶ **a copy** a single document
- ▶ **a document** a piece of paper with official information on it
- ▶ **to fill in something/to fill out something** If you fill in a form or fill out a form, you write all the information on it that you need to.
- ▶ **a form** a printed document that you have to write information on
- ▶ **your nationality** your legal membership of a country
- ▶ **original** An original document is the first one that was made, and not a copy of it.
- ▶ **a photocopy** a copy of a document made with a machine that takes photographs of documents
- ▶ **to sign (something)** to write your name on something
- ▶ **your signature** your name, written in the way you usually write it

What sort of certificate?



These are some certificates that are often needed when you fill in a form.

- ▶ **A birth certificate** is made when someone is born.
- ▶ **A divorce certificate** is made when someone gets divorced (= stops being married).
- ▶ **A marriage certificate** is made when someone gets married.
- ▶ **A death certificate** is made when someone dies.

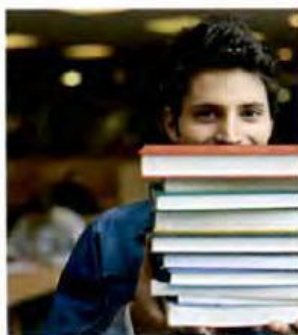
