

The Eagle and Its Young

Eagles are strong birds that take great care of their young. Before the eggs are laid, the parent eagles build a large nest called an **eyrie**. They choose a high place, such as a tall tree or a rocky cliff, where the nest is safe from danger. The nest is made from sticks, twigs, grass, and soft leaves to keep the eggs and chicks warm and comfortable.

After the chick's hatch, both parents work together to protect them. The mother eagle stays near the nest to guard the chicks from bad weather and enemies. The father eagle flies long distances to find food. Eagles have sharp eyes and powerful talons that help them catch fish, rabbits, snakes, and small birds. The parents tear the food into tiny pieces so the chicks can eat it easily.

As the young eagles grow stronger, they flap their wings and practice flying near the nest. Their parents continue to protect and feed them until they are ready to hunt and live on their own in the wild.
