Yayoi Kusama – Conceptual Art

Yayoi Kusama was born in Matsumoto, Japan, in 1929, in a society where women had little or no voice, and even less so in the arts. In 1957, at the age of 28, she moved to New York to look for a new way to express her artistic mind and spirit. At the age of 10, Yayoi Kusama met the world of color, sculpture, and modeling arts for the first time. Since then, she has been fascinated with it. She began creating works of art in which fantasy and reality came together, where nothing was as it seemed. These works were intended to reflect the hallucinations that her own mind was producing. They were the solution Kusama thought of to counteract the effects of her mental disorder. She simply painted what she saw. She is part of the pop art movement. She also became a writer and film producer. Today, she continues to present in art exhibitions around the world and in her home country of Japan.
