Present Perfect

S + have/has + V3/ed

USE OF YET

Yet means “up to now”.

We usually use yet in:

1. Negative sentences

S + haven't/hasn't + V3 + yet

Example:

- I haven't finished my homework yet.
- She hasn't eaten lunch yet.

2. Questions

Have/Has + S + V3 + yet?

Example:

- Have you finished your homework yet?
- Has Tom arrived yet?
