Task 1 — Detective Intuition Test

Free answers. Expected examples:

- **PAST:** yesterday, ago, finished, completed, last week, in 2019
- **NOW / RESULT:** just, already, experience, result, now, ever, never

Task 2 — Contradictory Evidence

- 1. Witness A — "I saw" = Past Simple (finished action).
- 2. Witness B — "I have seen" = Present Perfect (connection to present).
- 3. Our mission is to understand the difference between Past Simple and Present Perfect to analyze the evidence and find the thief.

Task 3 — Grammar Discovery

- **Finished Past (Past Simple):** ① and ④. Markers: *yesterday, last Friday*.
- **Connection to Present (Present Perfect):** ② and ③. Markers: *just, three times in his life*.

Rule: Past Simple → finished action at a specific past time. Present Perfect → action connected to the present (result / experience / unfinished period).

Task 4 — The Timeline Code

- Present Perfect form: **have / has + V3** (past participle).
- PS markers: *last week / ago*. PP markers: *already / never / since / yet*.
- Examples: *I went* (PS) / *I have lost* (PP).

Task 5 — Interrogation Room (Model Dialogue)

- D: *Have you ever been to London?* — W: *Yes, I have.*
- D: *When did you go there?* — W: *I went there last year.*
- D: *Did you see anyone suspicious yesterday?* — W: *No, I didn't.*
- D: *What time did you arrive at the museum?* — W: *I arrived at 9 PM.*
