★ Three levels of speaking support

● LEVEL A1 — “I CAN SAY IT”

You can use:

My name is...

I like...

My favorite... is...

I am interested in...

Target: approximately **20–30 seconds** if necessary.

● LEVEL A2 — “I CAN EXPLAIN IT”

Encourage:

I became interested in... because...

I usually...

One interesting thing about... is...

I would recommend... because...

Target: **30–45 seconds**.

● LEVEL B1 — “I CAN DEVELOP AN IDEA”

Include:
