The Sierra Gorda mountain range features oak-pine forests, limestone caves, and river basins formed by natural geological processes over millions of years.

Municipal authorities update local zoning laws and voting district boundaries to regulate public administration across the state.

During the Day of the Dead, local families gather in town plazas to build altar offerings with marigold flowers, traditional bread, and regional music.

An industrial corridor hosts multi-national manufacturing plants that produce automotive parts for international trade.

Rapid urban migration has significantly increased population density, altering age structures and increasing local housing demand.
